The National Global War on Terrorism (GWOT)
Memorial will not just be a place for all Americans to

The Foundation's work throughout 2023 moved us closer toward seeing this testament to American service and heroism come to life. Having secured a site on the National Mall for the Memorial, the Foundation has now moved into the design phase of the federally mandated, 24-step process for building a Memorial.

In keeping with our commitment to build the most comprehensive and inclusive war memorial in history, last fall we conducted our "Help Design History" campaign. This nationwide survey was designed to give those with personal experiences in the Global War on Terrorism a voice in the Memorial's design. Now our mission is to translate that feedback into telling the timeless stories of those involved in this multi-generational war, which still continues today.

Additionally, we took the important step of launching our "Answering the Call" capital campaign to raise \$110 million to build and sustain the Memorial.

In order to capture the wide diversity of experiences in the GWOT—whether uniformed or non-uniformed—the Foundation has also established a Design Advisory Council (DAC). The DAC is a body consisting of Gold Star family members, veterans, active-duty service members, and additional stakeholders, who will educate and advise our design team.

We firmly believe that this approach, which has never been done before in designing a national war memorial, will ensure that the Memorial's design properly reflects the diversity of experiences, service, and sacrifices in the GWOT, thereby telling the story of the countless everyday Americans who stepped forward to serve us all.

2023 was an exciting year of progress, but we're only midway through our journey. We'll continue to press on, for the sake of the countless Americans who have bravely stepped forward to serve us all. It's not just my humble privilege to lead this work—it's the core mission of my life.

ABOUT US



THE GLOBAL WAR ON TERRORISM (GWOT) MEMORIAL FOUNDATION

is the nonprofit organization designated by Congress to plan, fund, and build the National GWOT Memorial on the National Mall in Washington, D.C. **OUR MISSION** is to build a National Memorial honoring all the uniformed and non-uniformed personnel who have served and continue to do so in the Global War on Terrorism, as well as the family members and civilians who have supported them throughout the conflict.

OUR VISION for the Memorial is for it to be an inclusive and reverent space for all who have served and sacrificed in the GWOT. We also aim to recognize the ongoing nature of the war. The Memorial will:

★ HONOR // Salute all who served in this conflict: service members, civilians, and their families.

★ HEAL // Provide a focal point for healing and reflection on a complex, multigenerational conflict.

★ EMPOWER // Engage and educate civilian and military communities to build mutual understanding.

★ UNITE // Foster and sustain the sense of patriotism that brought all Americans together in the wake of 9/11 and catalyze support for those continuing to serve.

2023 YEAR IN REVIEW

SECURING A PLACE of HONOR on the NATIONAL MALL

The Foundation made significant progress on the Memorial's development in 2023.

After securing essential approvals from The National Capital Memorial Advisory Commission (NCMAC), the Commission of Fine Arts (CFA), and the National Capital Planning Commission (NCPC), the official location for the Memorial was announced on April 17, 2023.

The Memorial will sit within the Reserve of the National Mall at 23rd Street NW, Constitution Avenue NW, and Henry Bacon Drive NW. It will be only the fourth war memorial built within the Reserve joining the Vietnam, Korea, and World War II Memorials. The devotion of precious space within the Reserve to the Memorial attests to the GWOT's importance in American history, and the magnitude of the service and sacrifice.

Our generous supporters have made this achievement possible and helped us progress to the **Design Approval phase** (steps 13-19) of the 24-step Memorial construction process initiated with the Foundation's creation in 2015. »

DESIGN APPORVAL PHASE

- After site approval by NCPC and CFA, and comment by State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO), the design process begins.
- Memorial sponsor selects (1) a designer, or (2) a coordinator for design competition if a competition is to be held.
- Memorial sponsor selects preferred design concept and meets with National Park Service (NPS) or General Services Administration (GSA) to discuss issues that design may present.

 After possible refinements, sponsor submits the design concept and accompanying environmental assessment to NPS or GSA for approval.
- NPS or GSA reviews design concept and, upon concurrence, submits it to NCPC, CFA, and SHPO.
- Memorial sponsor, in close coordination with NPS or GSA, refines the design concept on the basis of agency comments and submits preliminary design to the landholding agency who, upon approval, submits it to NCPC, CFA, and SHPO.
- Memorial sponsor, in close coordination with NPS or GSA, refines preliminary design on the basis of agency comments and submits final design to NPS or GSA who, upon approval, submits it to NCPC, CFA, and SHPO.
- Memorial design team completes final drawings and specifications in close coordination with NPS or GSA.

HELP DESIGN HISTORY

A SURVEY OF ALL AMERICANS

Although the site for the National GWOT Memorial has been selected, the design has not. Consistent with our commitment that the Memorial be a sacred space for all Americans, not just veterans, the Foundation decided to gather input from every member of the public interested in providing it. This decision will help ensure that the Memorial articulates the experiences of various groups impacted by the GWOT, whether uniformed personnel, non-uniformed personnel, their loved ones, or civilians.


On September 26, the Foundation proudly launched a first-of-its-kind public input campaign, "Help Design History." This campaign gave the public the opportunity to answer survey questions regarding the ideal design for the Memorial. The original campaign ran for 22 days (September 26 to October 17), representing 22 years of America's ongoing fight against terrorism since September 11, 2001. It was then extended beyond the initial end date in order to maximize the amount of input collected.

To give those with personal experience with the GWOT a voice in the Memorial's design, Americans had the opportunity to provide their thoughts, inspiration, and dreams for the Memorial that will honor all those impacted by the Global War on Terrorism – including uniformed and non-uniformed military personnel, civilians, their families, and everyday men and women who have sacrificed to protect our freedom.
