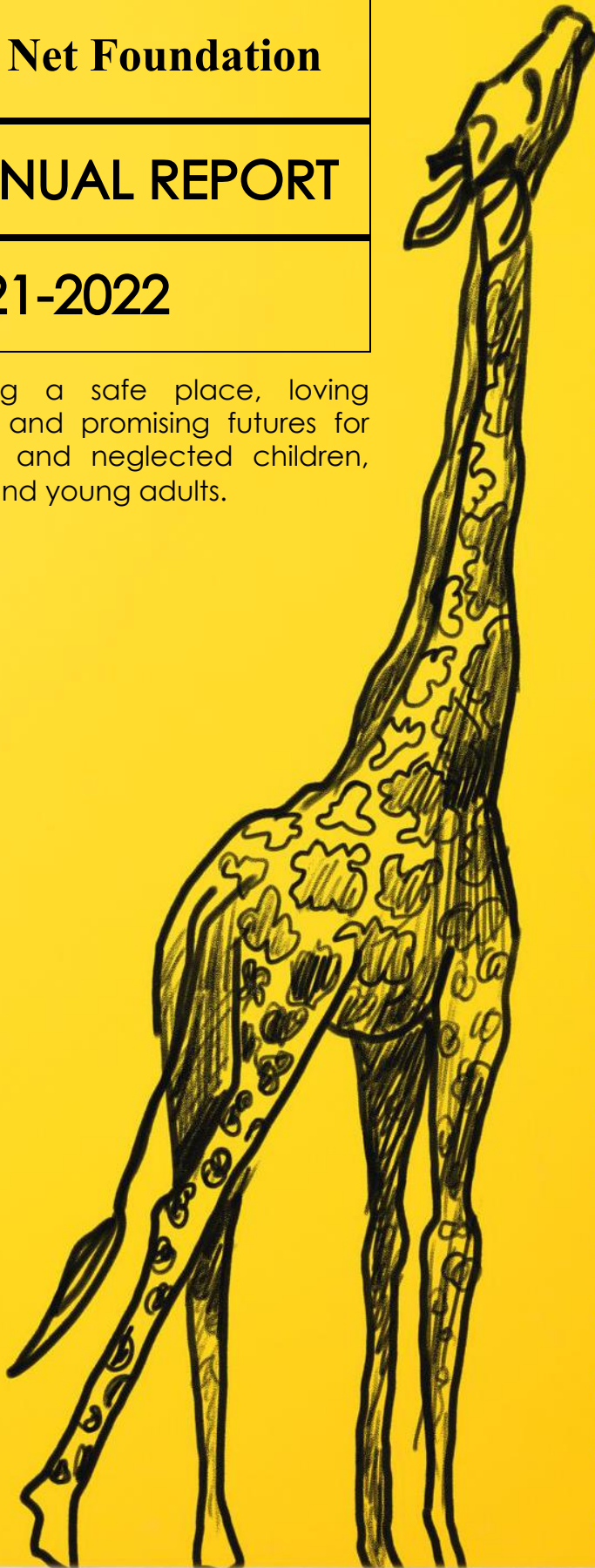

A WORD FROM OUR CEO

Dear Friends,

A safe place. A loving home. A promising future. This is how we measure success for all of us at Jonathan's Place.

When I think about everything we've accomplished over the last two years, I am grateful to everyone in our community who has helped support our mission. Supporters like you are why we can give each child who comes through our doors the opportunity to heal—and to thrive. You are a valued member of our community, and I am excited to share our 2021-2022 Annual Report with you.

As you read through the report pages, you'll find that Jonathan's place has experienced much growth in 2021 and 2022. Growth has allowed us to expand programs like our sex trafficking program, Restoring and Educating Survivors to Empowerment and Transformation (RESET), so that more children and teens will have the opportunity to heal from the trauma of abuse or neglect.

Community partnerships throughout the Dallas metroplex have been a key driver of this growth. Our recent partnership with After8toEducate and Dallas ISD at the Fannie C. Harris Youth Center is particularly noteworthy. Through this incredible partnership, we are helping provide shelter and resources for teens and youth experiencing homelessness and transitional housing for students. At the same time, they complete their high school education and prepare to enter adulthood. This partnership brings us right back to where we started in Dallas, and as we welcomed supporters at a reception at Fannie C. Harris in May of 2023, it felt like a homecoming. When we first started, we had one impactful program with hopes to expand. Today, we are helping those we serve with seven programs!

Our Mission

Jonathan's Place provides a safe place, loving homes and promising futures for abused and neglected children, teens, and young adults.



Because of the recent growth we've experienced, we're poised to better meet the unique needs of abused children in our community by expanding our continuum of care. We want to ensure that a child who enters the system doesn't stay in the system—we want these kids to have the resources they need to enter healthy adulthood and access a brighter future defined by abundant possibilities. To that end, I am pleased to report that we are closer than ever to realizing our vision of creating an independent living facility for homeless youth and those transitioning out of foster care on our campus. Because of the support of friends, donors, and community partners, we know we will soon have exciting updates to share about this housing facility.

At Jonathan's Place, we have met with many successes, like providing 34,374 care days to children placed in our care and helping 21 children find their forever families by facilitating adoptions in FY 2022. But none of these successes would have been possible without the kindness and generosity of individuals like you. Thank you for all of your support as we experience new milestones both as an organization and alongside the children and youth we serve!

WHO WE SERVE

Jonathan's Place serves children, teens, and young adults who have experienced abuse and neglect by providing support, care, and resources.

Children and Adolescents: We offer emergency shelter, therapeutic programs, and transitional living services to children and adolescents who have been removed from their homes due to abuse, neglect, and other challenging circumstances. We provide a safe and nurturing environment where these young individuals can heal, receive counseling, access educational support, and develop essential life skills.

Young Adults: Our transitional living program caters to young adults who have aged out of the foster care system or are at risk of homelessness. This program offers housing, case management, educational support, job readiness training, and other resources to help young adults transition into independent living and build a foundation for a self-sufficient future.

Families: We recognize the critical role of families in a child's well-being. We provide family therapy, parenting education, and support services to help strengthen family relationships, improve communication, and enhance the overall functioning of families.

Community: We collaborate with local authorities, child welfare agencies, schools, and other community organizations to provide a comprehensive support network for the individuals they serve. They actively work to raise awareness about child abuse prevention, offer educational resources to the community, and promote the well-being and safety of children and families in the broader community.

CHILD ABUSE IN TEXAS



REPORTED NUMBERS IN THE STATE

In 2022, DFPS received 317,928 reports related to child protective services. Two years before, there were 279,128 calls. That's a difference of 38,800 calls.

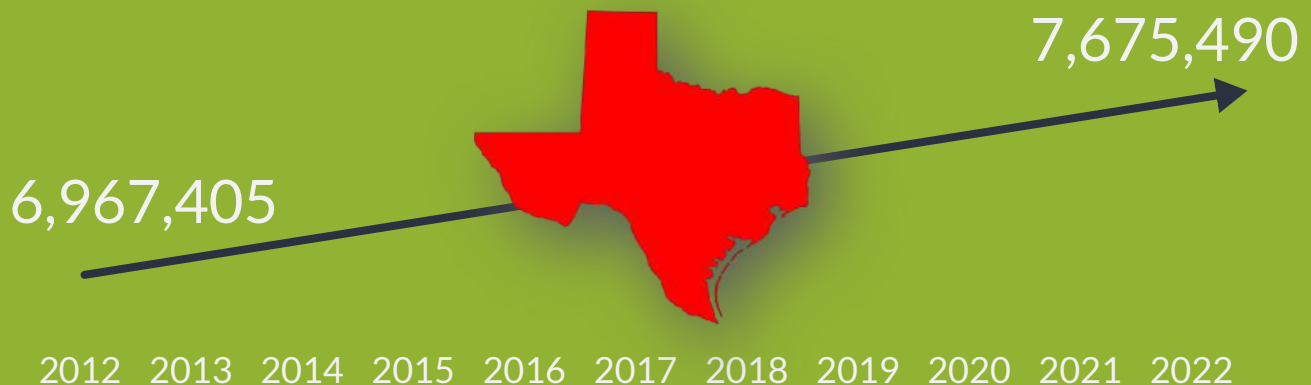
During the pandemic, children were tucked away at home and going to school virtually. This means that there were fewer eyes on kids and fewer people to report them as a child in danger.

DALLAS METROPLEX CHILDREN IN CARE

Alarming numbers of abused, abandoned, and traumatized children are entering Child Protective Services' foster care system in North Texas. In 2022, there were 5,818 confirmed cases of child abuse and neglect in Dallas County - the highest regional number in the state.

GROWTH AT JONATHAN'S PLACE

MAY 1991 -

Kid Net Foundation was established as a Texas Not-for-Profit Corporation. Granted an IRS 501(c)(3) designation status.

SEPTEMBER 1994 -

Jonathan's Place celebrated its grand opening.

SEPTEMBER 2003 -

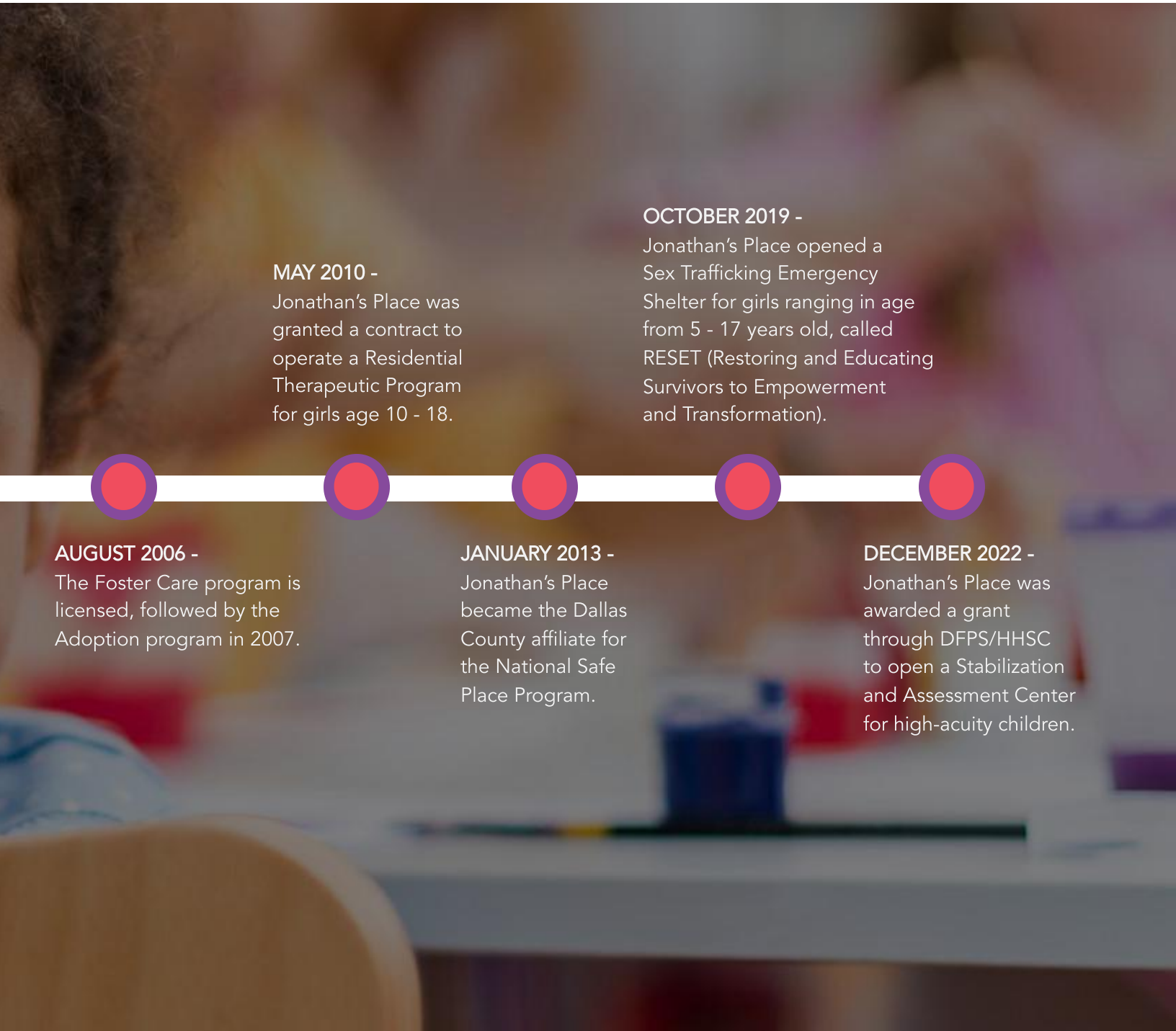
Phase I of the project was completed and two new cottages on a 29 acre campus in Northeast Dallas County began accepting children. Jonathan's Place essentially doubled its annual capacity for children in need.

AUGUST 1992 -

A facility was purchased and renovated, with most work being completed by volunteers and funded by in-kind donations.

FALL 1999 -

Jonathan's Place changed its license to an emergency shelter, serving children age newborn to 11 years.



MAY 2010 -

Jonathan's Place was granted a contract to operate a Residential Therapeutic Program for girls age 10 - 18.

OCTOBER 2019 -

Jonathan's Place opened a Sex Trafficking Emergency Shelter for girls ranging in age from 5 - 17 years old, called RESET (Restoring and Educating Survivors to Empowerment and Transformation).

AUGUST 2006 -

The Foster Care program is licensed, followed by the Adoption program in 2007.

JANUARY 2013 -

Jonathan's Place became the Dallas County affiliate for the National Safe Place Program.

DECEMBER 2022 -

Jonathan's Place was awarded a grant through DFPS/HHSC to open a Stabilization and Assessment Center for high-acuity children.



EMERGENCY SHELTER

Jonathan's Place is an exceptional emergency shelter that provides crucial support and care for children in crisis situations. This renowned facility offers a safe haven for children who have experienced abuse, neglect, or are at risk of exploitation. With a compassionate and dedicated staff, Jonathan's Place strives to create a nurturing environment where these vulnerable children can heal and rebuild their lives.

We served 47 children and teens in our Emergency Shelter in 2022. The average length of stay is 54 days.

At Jonathan's Place, our emergency shelter stands as a comforting haven tailored to meet the urgent needs of children in distress. We go beyond mere accommodation, providing a welcoming atmosphere where every child finds not just a bed, but a warm embrace, hearty meals, and the comfort of essential amenities. Our dedicated staff members are not just caregivers; they are compassionate guides, trained to offer emotional support, counseling, and educational resources to help children navigate through their challenges and rediscover a sense of security and stability.

We understand that healing requires more than just physical care. That's why Jonathan's Place offers a holistic approach, encompassing medical attention, therapy sessions, and educational support, all customized to address each child's unique journey. Through this tailored approach, we empower them to heal, learn, and flourish.

Collaboration is at the heart of our mission. We work hand in hand with local authorities, child welfare agencies, and community organizations to ensure that every child receives the legal and social support necessary to navigate their circumstances with resilience and hope.

Jonathan's Place stands as a beacon of hope, offering solace to children in distress. With our safe haven and comprehensive services, we not only protect their well-being but also nurture their potential, safeguarding their futures with compassion and care.

TRANSITIONAL LIVING PROGRAM

The transitional living program at Jonathan's Place offers a vital stepping stone for young adults who have aged out of the foster care system or are at risk of homelessness. This program provides a supportive and structured environment that equips participants with the necessary life skills, resources, and guidance to transition into independent living successfully.

At Jonathan's Place, the transitional living program recognizes young adults' unique challenges as they navigate self-sufficiency. The program offers safe and stable housing, ensuring participants have a secure place to call home during this critical phase. The program also provides comprehensive case management services, including educational support, job readiness training, financial literacy, and assistance accessing healthcare and other essential resources.



HELPING YOUNG ADULTS 14-23 TRANSITIONING OUT OF FOSTER CARE



The transitional living program at Jonathan's Place fosters a sense of community and belonging. Participants engage in group activities, workshops, and community service projects, allowing them to develop social connections and a support network. The program also encourages and guides participants in developing and maintaining healthy relationships, setting personal goals, and making positive choices that will contribute to long-term success.

The transitional living program at Jonathan's Place is vital in empowering young adults to break the cycle of homelessness and achieve self-sufficiency. Providing a nurturing and supportive environment, comprehensive resources, and guidance, the program equips participants with the skills and confidence they need to thrive as independent, responsible, and successful individuals.

At Jonathan's Place, we're dedicated to providing a lifeline of support for girls aged 10 to 17 who have faced unimaginable hardships. Licensed by the State of Texas, our Girls Residential Therapeutic Program offers a safe haven and comprehensive care for those who have experienced physical, emotional, and often traumatic sexual abuse.

Our team of compassionate professionals, including program staff, case managers, psychiatrists, psychologists, and therapists, work tirelessly to empower these resilient young individuals. Through personalized support and evidence-based therapies, we guide them on a journey of healing and recovery.

Every day, we witness the transformation of these brave girls as they build resilience, regain confidence, and rediscover their inner strength. At Jonathan's Place, we're committed to providing hope and a brighter future for those who need it most.



SARA'S STORY

Sara entered the Girls Residential Therapeutic Program at Jonathan's Place after suffering sexual abuse and also sexually abusing her younger sibling. She struggled with the trauma that she experienced and the pain she caused her family. Sara would go days without eating, and when she did eat, she would immediately run to the bathroom. She did this over a three-to-four-month time frame, and in that time, Sara lost over 40 lbs as she struggled with bulimia.



Sara went into a deep depression. She started to act out at school, skipping classes, vaping, and drinking alcohol. She also exhibited risky behavior in her friendships and relationships.

Our treatment team, consisting of case managers and therapists, came together weekly to discuss resources and tools for Sara. We were able to get her an appointment with a GI doctor, which confirmed her eating disorder. Her daily menu was altered by adding meal replacement drinks and her favorite foods to meet her needs. She also started seeing a therapist for her trauma and a behavior therapist for her behavior challenges two or three times a week. She also participated in life skills classes, where she learned about healthy and unhealthy relationships, the dangers of vaping, and the importance of education. The team weighed Sara weekly, and our nurse practitioner could see her efforts and progress. During a recent check-in, our team learned that she had regained her weight, passed her STAAR test, and was promoted to the 11th grade. We are so proud of the progress Sara has made!



RESET

24 girls served in 2022.

Restoring and Educating Survivors to Empowerment and Transformation

The Dallas-Fort Worth region accounts for **35% of the state's commercial sexual exploitation cases** even though they only have 26% of the state's entire population.

Of the 350 law enforcement agencies in Texas, **only four** have federally funded task forces devoted to human trafficking.

On a typical weekend night in the state of Texas, **an estimated 188 girls under 18** are commercially sexually exploited through internet classified sex ads.

At Jonathan's Place, we are addressing the urgent effects of child sex trafficking on our community. Through our RESET (Restoring and Educating Survivors to Empowerment and Transformation) program, we're tailoring comprehensive care to the unique needs of survivors. By offering services through our RESET Emergency Shelter and specialized long-term therapeutic foster care, we're guiding them toward promising futures.

Child sex trafficking remains a significant challenge in Texas, with over 78,000 victims estimated statewide. Vulnerable youth, including those in foster care or facing homelessness, are at high risk. Without proper support, they endure mental health challenges and remain vulnerable to further exploitation.

Our RESET program is proactive and holistic, providing trauma-informed care within our RESET Emergency Shelter and specialized foster homes. Through strategic staffing and collaboration, we ensure that each youth receives personalized services, from therapy to education. Our aim is clear: to actively guide survivors from darkness to empowerment, step by step.



SAFE PLACE

At Jonathan's Place, we continue to answer the call any time of day in partnership with the National Safe Place program. The National Safe Place program stands as a beacon of hope and protection for children and teens nationwide, offering a lifeline to those facing crises.

Through a network of designated Safe Place sites, this initiative ensures that vulnerable youth can access immediate assistance and support when they find themselves in dangerous or uncertain circumstances. By providing a quick response in coordination with a visible and accessible network of locations and comprehensive training for staff and volunteers, we continue to uphold our mission of safeguarding the well-being of young people in need.

Locally, QuickTrip (QT) locations are designated Safe Places that coordinate with us, as a licensed Safe Place agency, to provide safe shelter for children and teens in need. Jonathan's Place stands ready to respond around the clock, ensuring that every child and teen receives the care and protection they deserve during times of crisis. This partnership reinforces our dedication to creating a community where every young person feels safe and supported, no matter the circumstances. Additionally, we are proud to collaborate with Dallas Area Rapid Transit (DART) to extend our reach and accessibility and ensure that vulnerable youth have access to safe havens throughout the region.

Over 175 children were placed in homes through our Foster Care and Adoption program in 2022.

The foster care program at Jonathan's Place is designed with a child-centered approach, ensuring each child's physical, emotional, and psychological needs are met with compassion and expertise. We work tirelessly to recruit and train qualified foster parents who can offer stable and nurturing homes to children who cannot safely remain with their biological families.

Our foster parents undergo rigorous screening and training to create a safe and nurturing environment, ensuring every child receives the care and support they deserve. From providing essential guidance and resources to offering ongoing support, we are committed to helping families navigate the complexities of fostering and adoption.

In addition to foster care, we also focus on adoption services. We actively work towards finding permanent, loving homes for children who are ready for their forever families. Our dedicated team guides prospective adoptive parents through the adoption process, providing them with the necessary resources and support to welcome children into their lives.

At Jonathan's Place, we believe that every child deserves a loving and supportive home environment. Through our comprehensive Foster Care & Adoption program, we strive to make this a reality for the many vulnerable children in our community.



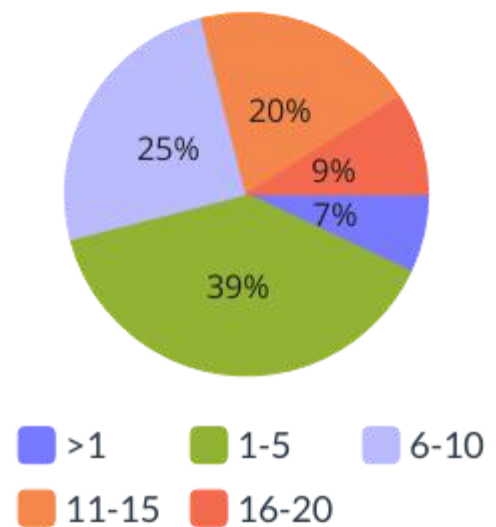

Kids in Foster Care by Age (U.S.)

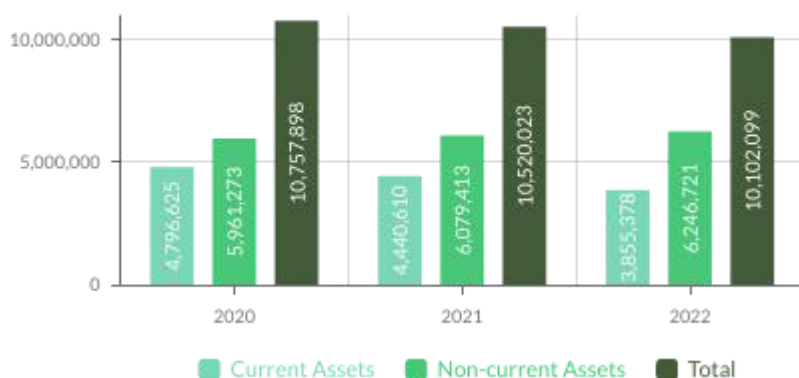

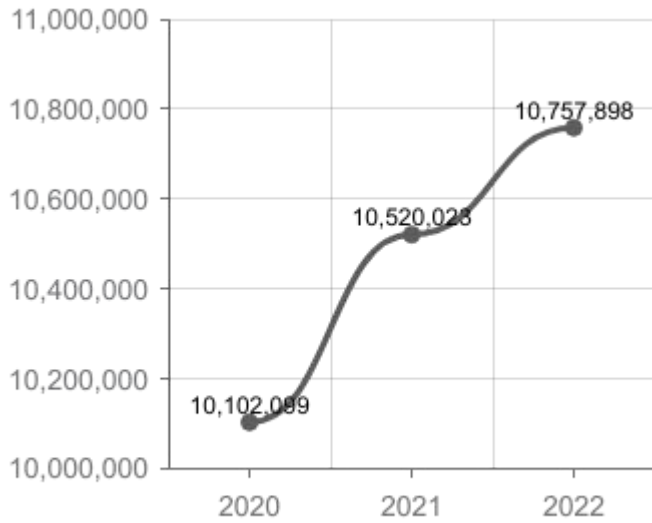
THREE-YEAR REVENUE OVERVIEW 2020-2022



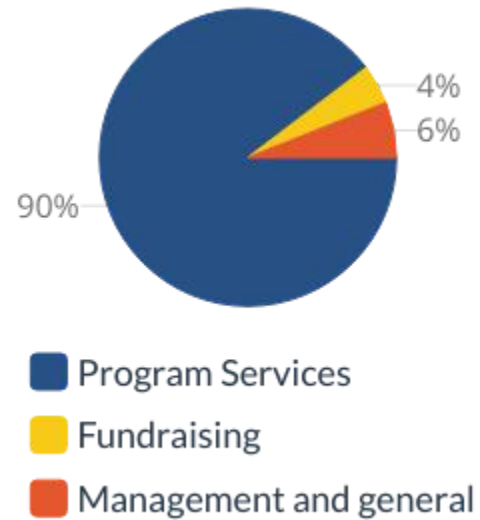

WHY WE SERVE

IN TEXAS

- There are 29,991 children in foster care in Texas.
- Of those children, 5,249 are waiting for adoptive families.
- At any given time, **313,000 people** are being trafficked in Texas. That includes 79,000 children and youth who are victims of sex trafficking.
- Texas has the 5th highest rate of people experiencing homelessness.
- In the 2021-2022 school year, more than 96,000 Texas students were identified as homeless.
- Dallas ISD reported 4,368 students experiencing homelessness last year, up from 3,500 the prior school year.

IN THE US

- There are about 4.5 million adopted children in the United States, which is 7% of the population.
- The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services states that there are almost 114,000 foster children eligible for and waiting to be adopted.
- Over half (51.6%) of the criminal human trafficking cases active in the U.S. were sex trafficking cases involving only children.
- In the United States, human trafficking tends to occur around international travel hubs with large immigrant populations, notably in California, Texas, and Georgia.
- Each year, an estimated 4.2 million youth and young adults experience homelessness in the United States, **700,000 of which are unaccompanied minors.**

DONOR SPOTLIGHT

Our loyal donors are critical to our ability to provide a safe place, a loving home, and a promising future for children who have suffered abuse and neglect. Reid and Stacey Walker are just one example – their loyal commitment as volunteers, donors, and general supporters has gone far to help us accomplish our mission.

"It is heartbreaking to know that so many children face horrible abuse and neglect in Texas," says Stacey.

As parents, Stacey explains that Jonathan's Place has long held a special place in their hearts. She was first introduced to Jonathan's Place as a Junior League volunteer in 2000. Reid, her husband, became involved not long after through his involvement in founding Capital for Kids, which was tied to Jonathan's Place. Stacey did hands-on volunteer work at Jonathan's Place for several years, then joined the Board of Directors in 2005. Today, her family frequently participates in Jonathan's Place special events, with their most cherished being the holiday season festivities, particularly the arrival of Santa via helicopter.

The Walker family's involvement with Jonathan's Place, over more than two decades has made an immeasurable impact on the children and families we serve. And they don't plan on slowing down anytime soon. Stacey says, "We feel lucky to be able to help!"

FOSTER FAMILY FESTIVAL

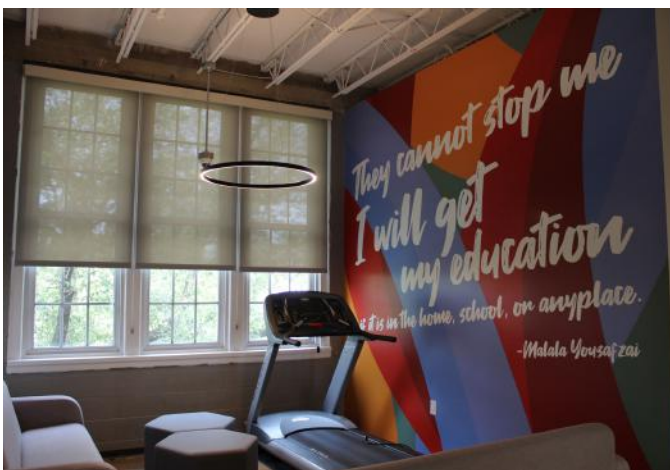
